Our Programs

Family Strengthening

Our team of local social workers and psychologists provides wraparound services and holistic support for the families of children who have recently been subject to processes within Child Protective Services.

Once we receive a case referral, our team assesses the family's situation, creating a comprehensive plan to cater to the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of each family and individual. We conduct home visits and families also travel to our office, where they receive counseling and participate in different group activities, such as play therapy, after-school tutoring and teen support groups.

Families move through various phases of intervention, entering and graduating from the program on a rolling basis. The end goal is for families to graduate successfully from the program, having become self-sufficient and able to successfully break cycles of poverty and abuse in their family.



Child Advocacy



While our hope is for families to flourish as a result of our Family Strengthening program, we continually encounter cases of children who are in danger. Upon identifying these situations, which can include abuse, neglect, abandonment and other tragic issues, our Child Advocacy team immediately springs into action. We don't rest until every child is safe.

Our Child Advocacy program includes:

- An in-depth analysis and observations from clinical professionals (Social Workers and Psychologists)
- Legal representation of and advocates for specific children in various public spaces, including Child Protection agencies, Family and Children's court, among others)
- Close coordination with Child Protection authorities among various agencies in El Salvador
- Transportation services in emergency situations
- Collaboration with other public and private service providers

Our Impact in 2022





The new law for child protection, "Crecer Juntos", was approved by Congress in Fl. Salvador, effectively replacing the LEPINA law.



June, 2022

Perhaps the most important milestone in Project RED's history has been the implementation of this law. The LEPINA law was what motivated Project RED to begin its work in 2011, when thousands of children were removed from orphanages and forced to live with members of their biological families.

The struggle to work amicably with the government has challenged us over the years; however, the situation has completely changed for the better. Project RED is a strategic partner of El Salvador's Child Protection System, allowing us to achieve greater impact for every child we serve.

We ask that you join us in prayer for the government leaders as they implement this new, hope-filled law, whose implementation begins on January 1, 2023.

Project RFD opened its third location in San Miguel, El Salvador.



July, 2022

Since Project RED's founding in 2011, we have long anticipated this momentous milestone. The Eastern side of El Salvador, from where the majority of Salvadoran immigrants living in the United States come, is ridden with crime, violence, abuse and unimaginable poverty. The resources are scarce and programs like Project RED's are nowhere to be found. Having reached a point of organizational capacity at which we are able to replicate our programs, several of the Project RED team members made the move to the other side of the country to launch this new location.

With the pandemic restrictions in El Salvador finally at ease, we were able to conduct our normal, community-building and life-giving activities at the end of the year. We poured love into the lives of the kids and families we have the honor of serving and further built community.





Goals in 2023



Expand our scope to impact more children and families at our new San Miguel location

The Eastern side of El Salvador, has greater poverty and abuse rates than any other region of the country. Social services are scarce and, in some places, nonexistent. We believe that Project RED's support is most urgently needed in this region and plan to continue to expand our scope to include more cases in this area in 2023.



Explore additional opportunities for program replication

Because Project RED has grown organically as a local, grassroots organization, its reputation in El Salvador continues to build. As the organization gains institutional capacity, we believe that more opportunities will continue to arise as we expand our work in the region.







Deepen technical skills through training opportunities for staff



Project RED's team of local professionals is committed, passionate and talented. With a mixture of staff members who have been part of the team for many years and possess a deep knowledge of the work, as well as newer team members whose specialized professional experiences help to provide quality care for those we serve, we are committed to providing growth opportunities for our staff as the organization continues to develop.



Implement new, evidence-based policies and procedures as we professionalize the organization's operations

Project RED works with cases of children, adolescents and adults who have experienced unimaginable trauma. In El Salvador, the very concept of trauma, trauma-informed care and the competencies required to effectively impact services are not commonly known. We are committed to being a trauma-competent "system" in which our staff is protected from secondary trauma through our collective practices, as we learn techniques that can best impact these cases in the most effective way possible.
